WORSHIP NOTES

Lent – A period of forty days (not counting Sundays) before Easter, Lent was originally a period of preparation for those to be baptized at Easter. It later became a time of penitence for all Christians. Thus, it emulated the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing for His ministry, resisting temptations. Christians often fast or give up various things during Lent to remind them of Christ's sacrifice and to overcome destructive habits. Christians may also take on disciplines as they learn new habits that are constructive and useful for disciples of Jesus Christ. The liturgical color of the Lenten season is purple (symbolizing penitence). Gray and other deep earth tones, along with burlap (sackcloth) and other rough textures, may also be used.

JAM stands for “**Jesus And Me**” and will be our 2 classes for children. PreK through Grade 2 and Grades 3-6. We welcome any middle schoolers who desire to mentor and build relationships with our younger kids. **JAM** will be held after Children’s Time that takes place during worship. We will have an engaging, fun, children’s sermon and following that, children will join their classes in the education wing upstairs.

JAM Happenings: During Lent, the children will be participating in the Great Can Rolloff. Every age group will be encouraged to bring in canned goods to donate to the food bank. Before we deliver the cans, we will roll them down an incline to see which will roll/race the farthest. Can rolling will take place during JAM class on **March 26th**. Bring in cans from now until then and they will be kept and labeled for racing on that day.

Early Worship at 8:30 am in the Sanctuary – a more intimate service, approximately 45 minutes, with a simple worship order including the sermon and two congregational hymns with piano accompaniment.

Service for The Lord’s Day - at 11:00 am – in the sanctuary. This traditional worship service includes a fuller liturgy, with sermon and congregational hymns. A variety of musical styles are offered by our various choirs accompanied by the pipe organ, piano and other musical instruments. **Next Sunday** sharing in the Ministry of Music will be the Chancel Choir.

One Great Hour of Sharing for over 70 years, One Great Hour has provided Presbyterians with a way to share God’s love with our neighbors in need around the world. In a world of disaster, wars, hunger and oppression, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity.

The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing are:

- **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)**, receives 32% of funds raised - OPC supports PDA directly. However, funds collected by One Great Hour greatly add to those donations. PDA works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after devastation due to natural or human-caused disasters. PDA also supports refugees.
- **Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP)**, receives 36% of amount raised. PHP takes action to alleviate hunger and works to reduce poverty that leads to hunger.
- **Self-Development of People (SDOP)** invests in communities responding to their experience of oppression, poverty and injustice, and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues. SDOP receives 32% of funds raised.
