In October of 1988 I was called to serve as pastor of the Riverside Presbyterian Church in Oakmont. In the meantime, I continue to be committed to my ministry at OPC. I look forward to my ongoing work with the Session, the staff and congregational members.

I invite your prayers. My goal for these next 18 months is to fulfill the vow I took when I began: to serve Christ and you with energy, intelligence, imagination and love.
