Mending Wall
Something there is that doesn't love a wall,
That sends the frozen-ground-swell under it,
And spills the upper boulders in the sun;
And makes gaps even two can pass abreast.... Robert Frost



Beloved in Christ,

Robert Frost's poem "Mending Wall" still speaks today when citizens of our country are mightily divided. Our two political parties most often take party-line votes. You can choose which tv news is aligned with the party of your choice. And some people are calling for acts of political violence. We have good reason to worry about our country.

We Christians dare not be self-righteous or judgmental about current divisions. Churches have long struggled with division. We read of it in Paul's first letter to the Christians in Corinth.

For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, 'I belong to Paul," or 'I belong to Apollos,' or 'I belong to Christ.' (1 Corinthians 1:11-12)

However, as we read in the Letter to the Ephesians (2:14), we have reason to be hopeful.

For [Christ Jesus] is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups (Jews and Gentiles) into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us.

Community-with-differences is one of the gifts the followers of Jesus have to offer to the world – the realization that, although we are different, in Christ we are more siblings than enemies.

Each time we celebrate the Lord's Supper I look into the congregation and I am aware of the differences among us. Differences of age and stage of life, income, employment, as well as political party although real are secondary to our oneness in Christ. We give witness to that at each communion celebration when we gather together around one table. As we have sung "We are One in the Spirit, We Are One in the Lord".

While Frost doubts that "good fences make good neighbors" he mentions "spring mending-time" when he and his neighbor would repair the stone wall that the groundswell and the hunters had damaged. Perhaps each Sunday can be something of our mending-time when we reach across to someone, not that we will easily repair any breach, but perhaps God will use our contact to reduce the division lest the distance become great.

Because of our oneness in Christ we may still sing "America the Beautiful" while we also pray, may God thy gold refine.



The children have been enrolled for daycare, and Lalia will now have the opportunity to work. Everyone seems excited for this next step.

A sewing machine has been donated to the family, and **Lalia** has eagerly started making clothing. Lalia has bought herself a waffle iron with some of her gift cards and is making some amazing waffles and donut type pastries. She also wanted a charcoal grill and has been grilling as well. Lalia has been having four 2-hour lessons a week for English: 2 with Pittsburgh Literacy online, and 2 with our team

member Jean Wimer. She is also having an evening of learning math and budgeting every week with Sandy Wahnsiedler. The team is helping Lalia to learn to grocery shop online with Giant Eagle/Aldi.

Anjelani has been attending several classmates' birthday parties. She was shy and clingy at first, but now understands the fun and is very excited to get the invitations. She has been attending summer camp at RCC this summer. She has learned to swim, taken 3 field trips, and has made many friends. She won the Life of the Party award where she received a bike helmet and a Frisbee. Her instructors tell us that she is doing very well at the school and is always in the thick of things. She even participated in a talent show where she sang with other girls — in English!

A refugee travel loan has been added to the financial obligations of the family. While we understand the need for this loan, it is a hardship for a single mom who will also be a single earner.

Sartiel and Daniel have been taking communication classes with DePaul School for Hearing and Speech. They had online music classes in the spring, and this summer they have had in person experiential classes, thanks to Pam Billet's efforts. The boys enjoy these classes and the fun they had at the park after the classes.
