Lent is one of the blessings of the Christian Year. Patterned after the 40 days and nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness, Lent is a season of 40 days of reflection and repentance by which we hope to be transformed and prepared to enter the joy of Easter. Our aim is to present ourselves to Christ with a penitent heart and mind so that Christ's transforming work may take place in us.

As writers of Christian spirituality have witnessed, we don't make these changes happen. Rather, we give God permission to be at work in us and our practice opens the door for the work of God's transforming Spirit.

Not only is the Lenten focus healthy for us individually, but Lent is also a season of communal spiritual growth. We share the journey of Lent with our sisters and brothers in Christ and we work together on spiritual goals which will make a difference in our lives and our relationships.

Look for continuing updates in the Sunday bulletins and in the monthly newsletter.


