

I am grateful that at OPC we have faced challenges together. Session has been and continues to be a group in which elders and pastors may express their ideas with conviction. We respect one another and understand that moving forward faithfully requires that we think and pray together through issues. Each person's input is essential to reach a healthy resolution.

Perhaps it is no secret that over the years church members have personally shared their convictions with me. Sometimes their sharing has risen out of concern for the health of the church. Other times, they have shared out of personal interest. What has mattered is that they have been willing to be honest with me. I have done my best to listen so that I may understand their point of view and then allow it to be a part of the wider church "conversation". Members' willingness to share honestly their thoughts and concerns have enabled me to understand issues more fully and, at times, to help leaders to be informed of lesser-known perspectives.

I have also been blessed by multiple members who have embraced a ministry of support for their pastor. Again, honesty-withrespect has characterized those relationships and conversations. At times, those "ministers to the pastor" have kept me from making mistakes. Other times, they've helped me see another side of issues. Always, their care has been an encouragement without which ministry would have been a pressing burden.

Another lesson I've learned in working with leaders and members is that the faithful and healthy resolution of issues is often hidden at the start. Only through conversations and prayer over time have healthy and faithful resolutions become clear. While some issues demand immediate and decisive action, the majority of the challenges have required thoughtful, prayerful deliberation over time.

Our church has benefitted from the resources of an excellent Presbytery staff. Our General Minister came and spoke to us about divisive theological issues. Our Stated Clerk has advised Session and me on prudent procedures. Our Associate Minister from the Presbytery has supported our staff and has helped us to see how many of our issues are present in and challenging to other churches.

Lastly, we have benefitted from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary faculty. Not only have they led adult education seminars and preached in worship, they have offered their expertise in matters theological and programmatic.

While a congregation (and their pastor!) might wish for a challenge-free future, the real gift has been God's Spirit working through our speaking, listening and praying together.

My three sons have never known another QB. Their sense of loss was real, but their grief was mitigated by three things. The first was gratitude to Big Ben for years of extraordinary football. The second was a respect for his desire to retire. The third was hopeful anticipation about the future.

In Steve Wilson, we have a future hall-of-fame pastor. Let's grieve as we need to, but let our grief be mitigated first by gratitude for his years of extraordinary service. Second, by respecting his desire to retire. And third, by hopeful anticipation about the future of OPC with a pastor who we trust will one day join Steve in the Hall of Fame.
