A kit will include all materials to make the one Chrismon, instructions, pattern, needle, size 11 Aida cloth, floss, and beads, if that pattern calls for beads. The patterns are not complicated and can be completed easily, even if you are a beginning stitcher or you have not done cross stitch in a while.

There will be baskets by the PA and 5th street entrances for collection of the completed projects. We ask that all completed stitching be returned no later than Sunday, Oct 8th.



C. S. Lewis (1898-1963) is widely considered one of the most effective Christian thinkers of the twentieth century. He used his exceptional literary talents to set out the truth claims of Christianity. From his non-fiction works like *Mere Christianity* to his beloved children's books, *The Chronicles of Narnia*, to his science fiction work, *The Space Trilogy*, Lewis creatively described the Christian faith, defended it from critics, and above all, made clear why Christianity has an enduring appeal in an increasingly secular world.
