Dear Friends,

Many years ago, when Rudyard Kipling was one of the more popular writers of his time, it was reported that he received ten shillings for every word he wrote. Some students at Oxford University, less impressed with this success than they should have been, sent Kipling ten shillings with the request that he send them "one of your very best words." He cabled back: "Thanks."

That is one of the best words in any language, and it is worth so much both to the person who speaks it and to the person who hears it. It's why parents teach children early on to say "Thank you". It's why we celebrate Thanksgiving annually. It's why we come to God with our words of thanksgiving, as King David did when he wrote this song: "O give thanks to the Lord call on his name, make known God's deeds among the peoples!" There does seem to be something innate in us that moves us to thank God. Do you remember the beautiful song of thanksgiving in the production of *Godspell? All good gifts around us, Are sent from heaven above, Then thank the Lord, O thank the Lord, For all His love; I really want to thank the Lord.*

So we will gather here at Oakmont Presbyterian on November 19th for a Thanksgiving dinner, and join our voices in giving thanks to God, as is our tradition. It is a privilege and joy to express our thanks together as brother and sisters. When we do so, we should also think about those among us who are in dire and difficult circumstances. It is not easy or automatic for some to be thankful because their life is dark and difficult. Thanksgiving doesn't come easily or naturally when the load you are carrying weighs you down. I am thinking about Alexander Whyte, a Scottish preacher of a century ago. Rev. While always began his prayers with an expression of gratitude. One cold, miserable day his people wondered what he would say. He prayed, "We thank Thee, O Lord, that it is not always like this."

I don't know where you find yourself this Thanksgiving, but I do know that our hope is in the Lord, and we look forward to the future with faith. There is a new kingdom coming; we see the signs of it among us. While we work and wait, let's remember that Jesus' last words to his disciples were these: "I will be with you always, even unto the end of the world." (Matthew 28:20). Thank God!


A note from Ronnie...


