

#### **WORSHIP NOTES**

**Palm/Passion Sunday** - Worship celebrates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem amidst the joyful welcome of His followers and surprise of many residents. This day is the beginning of Holy Week. Purple is the main liturgical color for the season signifying penitence and preparation. Today we use the word "Hosanna!" many times. "Hosanna," is a cry for salvation, while, at the same time it is a declaration of praise. The older interpretations, "please save" or "save now," are also a popular understanding based on Psalm 118:25.

Worship next Sunday, March 31 – 8:30 am and 11:00 am, Festival of The Resurrection/Easter, Rev. Tim Spring will preach THE ROADS LESS TRAVELLED: The Road to the Empty Tomb based on Matthew 28:1-10.

Early Easter Worship at 8:30 am in the Sanctuary – a more intimate service in celebration of Christ's Resurrection, approximately 45 minutes, with a simple worship order including the sermon and two congregational hymns with piano accompaniment.

Service for The Lord's Day - at 11:00 am – in the sanctuary. This Festival Celebration of Christ's Resurrection includes a fuller liturgy, with sermon and congregational hymns. Sharing in the Ministry of Music will be the Chancel Choir, Trombone Quartet, percussion, Organ and Piano.

One Great Hour of Sharing - For over 70 years, One Great Hour has provided Presbyterians with a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need around the world. In a world of disaster, wars, hunger and oppression, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity.

The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing are:

- Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), receives 32% of funds raised OPC supports PDA directly. PDA works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after devastation due to natural or human-caused disasters. PDA also supports refugees.
- Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), receives 36% of amount raised. PHP takes action to alleviate hunger and works to reduce poverty that leads to hunger.
- Self-Development of People (SDOP) invests in communities responding to their experience of oppression, poverty and injustice, and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues. SDOP receives 32% of funds raised.
